## **December Holiday Party!**





## 2020 Box Making Classes





Andy Borland, Bill Carbin and Don Ames will be offering a <u>Simple Box Making</u> class in February, 2020 and they will be offering an <u>Advanced Box Making</u> class in April. In the first class you start by making a sled, which helps to produce perfect corner joinery, and you will learn how to make and use splines, which strengthen and decorate box corners. In the following advanced class you will tackle a more complex octagonal box design.

A sign-up list for the simple box making class will be available at the January meeting. Opportunity to sign up for the advanced class will begin in February. Cost for the simple box making class will be \$25 per person for AWG members. Estimated cost of the advanced box class is also \$25 per person, but will be defined prior to sign up time next February.

### **Pen Making**


