## Annapolis Woodworkers Guild

### Peter's recommendations for initial trial Dyes and Stains

Remember that dyes, once mixed in water (if on chlorinated water systems use distilled) at 150 degrees for faster mixing are in solution and will not precipitate out, but you may wish to filter it through a fine paint strainer. Stock solution is 1 oz. (by weight) powder to 1 pint of water-never dilute your stock solution-put a small amount of stock solution into another container and add water to dilute to the color intensity you desire, test on paper plates in good light.

Stains (oil or gel) are particles in suspension and tend to collect in and emphasize open-grained woods. Oil stains often need mixing as the particulate will settle to the bottom. Certainly on end grain but also on all surfaces you may want to use a sealcoat between the dye and stain to control absorption. Zinsser Seal Coat or dewaxed blonde shellac diluted to a 2 lb cut.

Source for Dye Powders are W.D. Lockwood.com out of NY order direct. They do not discount for volume but if you order at least five 1 oz. packets and specify you are ordering as a "sample pack" they will give a 10% discount.

Georgian Cherry; purple

Antique Walnut; a cooler (less red) brown

Candlelight; a warm orange red brown

This should give you a good base to start your finishing adventures, and as Peter likes to say, "Have fun with it!"

## RULES FOR THE SALE OF THE ROSENBERGER COLLECTION OF EXOTIC WOOD

This is a private sale, open to dues paying members of the Chesapeake Woodturners and the Annapolis Woodworkers Guild. The sale will be held on Saturday, April 21st outside the small barn at Joe Dickey's farm in Davidsonville. It will be part of the regular meeting of the Chesapeake Woodturners and will follow a short business meeting of the club that morning. Preview of the wood collection will start around 9 AM. The sale is designed so that everyone with an interest in buying wood will have an opportunity to obtain something of special interest to them. And no one will be in a position to buy large lots ahead of others. Club members interested in purchasing some wood are asked to wear their club badge. They will be assigned a number that will be put into a bowl. Numbers will be drawn randomly from the bowl. When a buyer's number is drawn, that person will be asked to make a selection from the collection. This will be followed in turn by the buyer with the next number drawn. Drawn numbers will be placed in a second bowl. Once all of the interested buyers have had an opportunity to make a first selection, the process will be repeated with numbers re-drawn out of the second bowl. Depending on time and remaining inventory, this cycle may be repeated a third time. After that, the wood will be available on a "come and get it" basis. In order to make this a quick and efficient process, buyers are asked to decide what they'd like to buy when they preview the wood, and to make a list of several preferences ahead of when their number is called. Prices are set to be well below the retail value of the wood. All given board-foot measurements are reasonable underestimates of the useable lumber in a single piece. Prices are non-negotiable up to the point that there are pieces of lumber that are unclaimed. Then further discounts will be considered. Payment should be in cash or by check. Checks should be made out to the Chesapeake Woodturners. Proceeds from the sale will be divided with 80% going to Jerry Rosenberger and 20% going to the Chesapeake Woodturners for the time and effort devoted to the transport, cataloging, organization and conduct of the sale. A 6% Maryland sales tax will be added to the purchase price. All wood purchased must be removed from the property after the sale is concluded. While neither Jerry nor the Chesapeake Woodturners can control the fate of the wood after it is purchased, the wood is priced and the sale conducted with the expectation that the purchasers are interested in using the wood for their own projects and not for resale with the goal of making a profit. Hopefully, this will be a collegial event – rewarding for everyone who participates, and blessed by pleasant Spring weather.
