And of course there was the annual Twelve Days of Woodworking Christmas led by the Guild chorus (recruited on the spot) and accompanied by Rodger Young on the flute.










The series of raffles came next with Paul drawing for the guest prize. The Guild's First Lady Geena Cowan (right) won a \$50 gift card.

Tip of the Month

How to Wrap Your Tool Handles - Get a Better Grip

I often find that clamps and other tools with small smooth handles are difficult to tighten, especially when my hands are dry from handling wood for a while. Recently I discovered a solution in a YouTube video by Rob Cosman who wraps his handles in hockey tape. Rob lives in Canada where, presumably, you can get hockey tape in the super market checkout line, but I could not find any so I used electrical friction tape (once known as "tar tape). I describe Rob's process below.
