Call for Speakers from the AWG Membership



After college, with little money and lots of books, he set to work building his own bookcases... he has been engaged in woodworking ever since. Adam got serious about fine furniture making in 2009 and now builds about 10-12



commissions each year, plus hundreds of cutting boards, wine displays, coasters, and other small items for sale in stores, pop-ups, and craft shows. He recently published an article on techniques for achieving a high sheen oil finish in *Fine Woodworking*.

While building numerous commissions and selling in stores, Adam still maintains a day job as a manager within DoD. On balance, he finds about 25-30 hours/week in the shop...more in the winter, less in the summer.

We currently have 3 types of drawings. All drawings are for members only. Each one is explained below:




