Bill Schneck brought this beautiful veneered chess table and a pictorial presentation to explain the techniques he used.



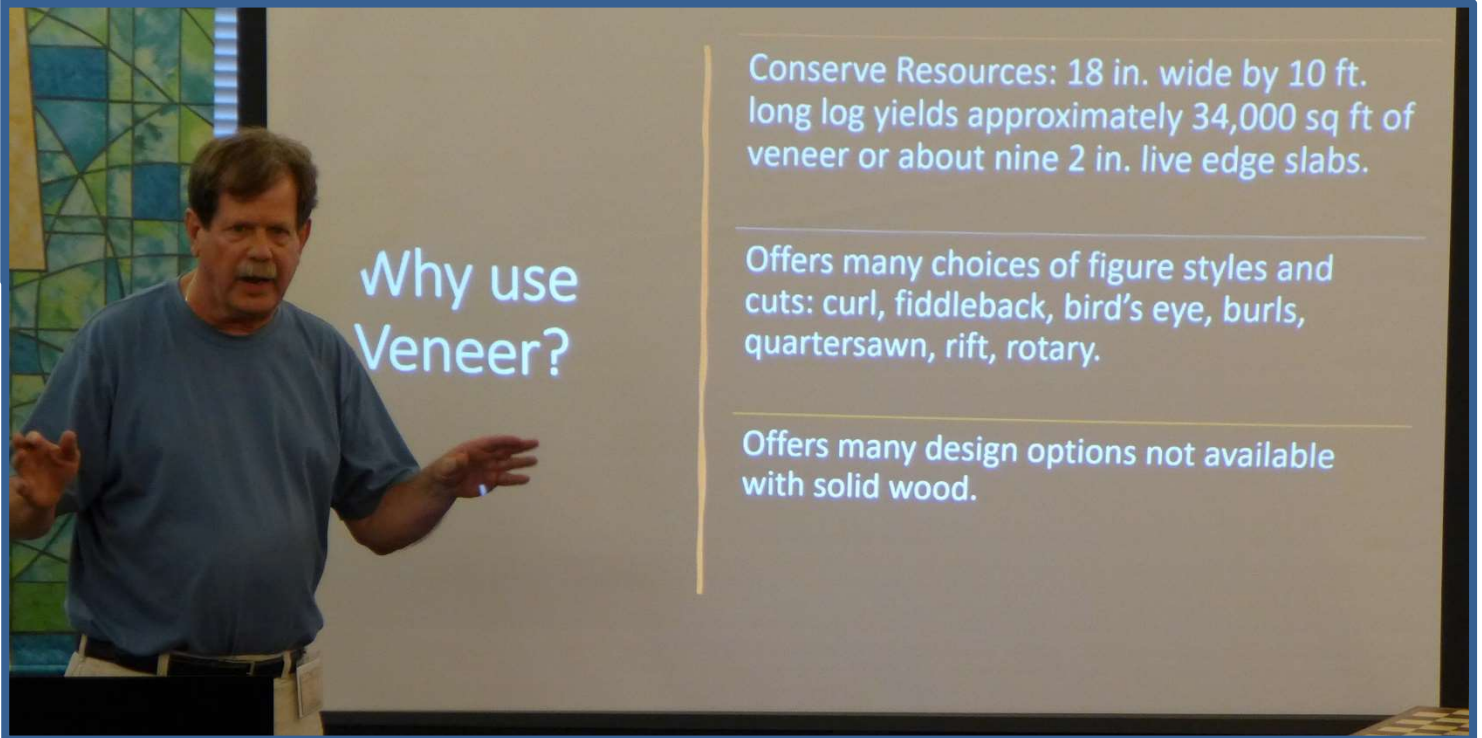
Bill's table – all surfaces are veneered

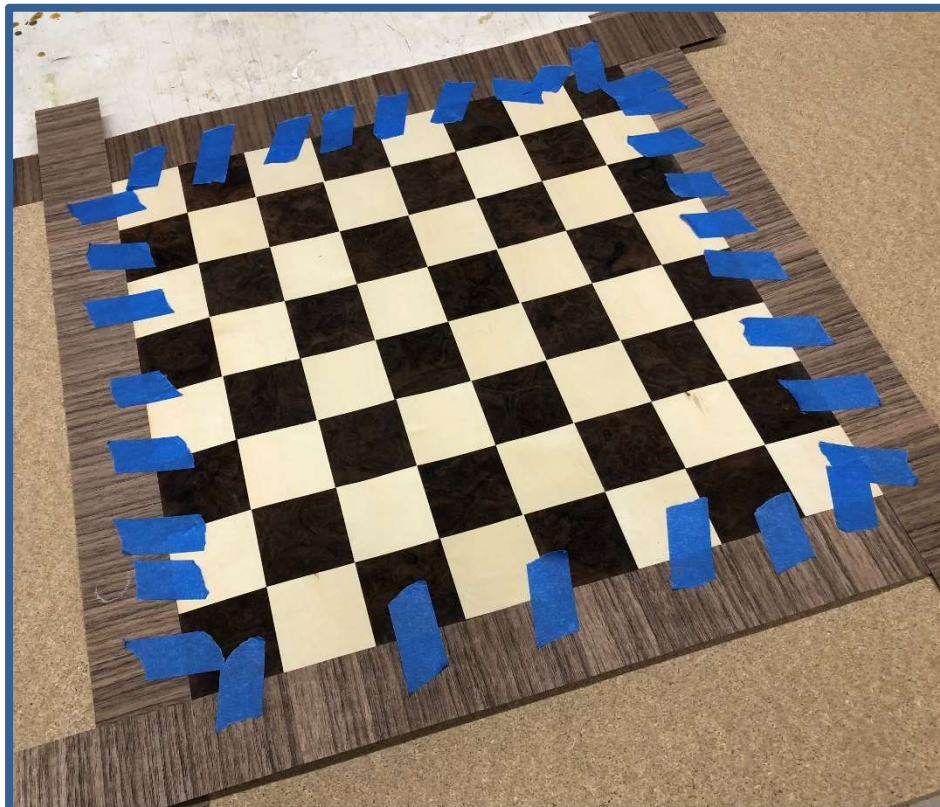
Bill photographically documented the construction of the table and brought it to the meeting as a well organized presentation.



This piece is an excellent example of the advantages of using veneer in projects. Bill presented the benefits of veneer and detailed explanations of the various techniques he used to apply veneer in complex patters and on complex shapes.

Rodger Young presented the fruits of his new mini-lathe - miniature bee hives (left) and the bees (right).



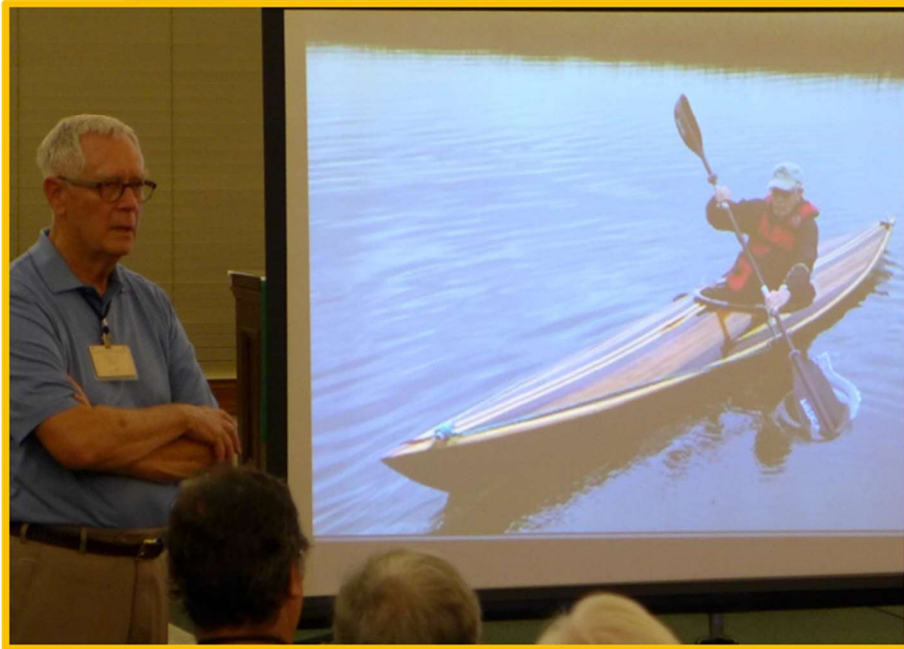
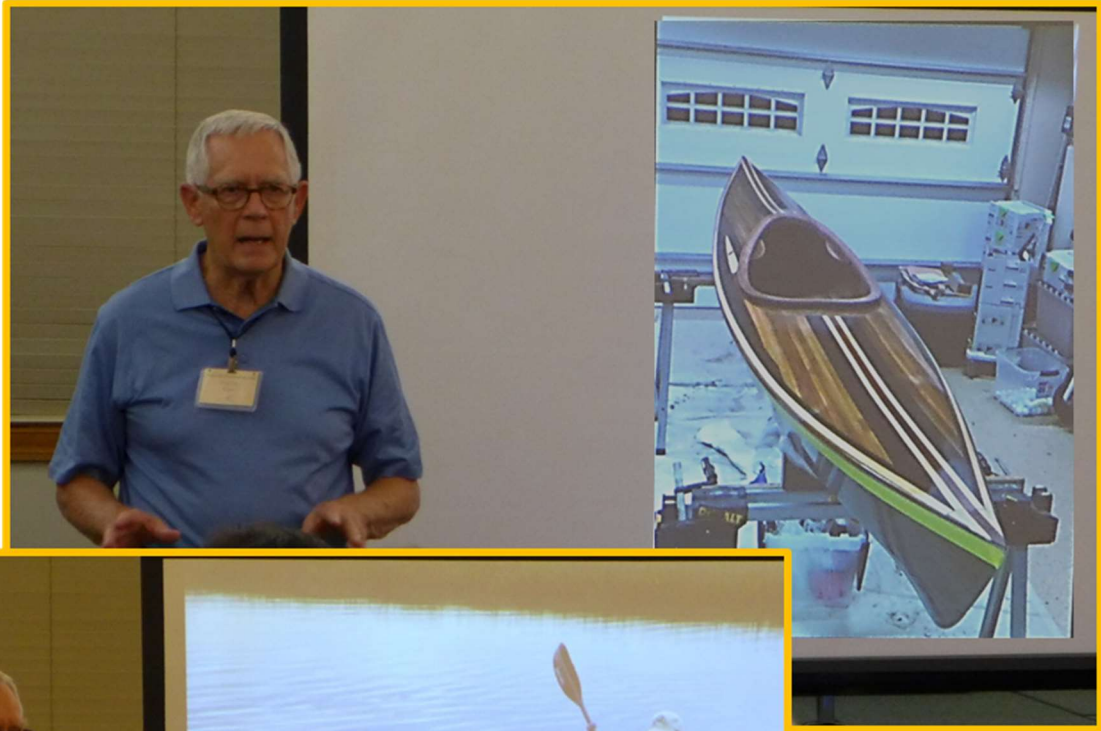
Candee Van Iderstine found these amazing boxes in an estate sale and brought them to show to the guild.

Thomas Point Shoal Lighthouse Restoration



The Thomas Point Shoal Lighthouse (TPSL) was installed at its location in 1875. It is a screw pile lighthouse and is the last one still located in its original location. Photographs of the lighthouse are found on Maryland State road maps, travel brochures and many other types of Maryland historical items. The ownership of the lighthouse is shared by the Annapolis Historical Society, Anne Arundel County, the Annapolis Maritime Museum, and the Chesapeake Chapter of the U.S. Lighthouse Society. The maintenance and upkeep is the responsibility of USLS.

In 2016, the lighthouse was vandalized. The Annapolis Woodworkers Guild president at the time, Will Hottle, contacted Henry Gonzales of the U.S. Lighthouse Society and offered the Guild's assistance to repair the damages. The response was that the damage had been repaired, but there were other repairs needed. Arrangements were made for AWG to visit the lighthouse to check out needed work. Bernie Lammers was asked to take the names of those interested and arrange the trip.

In the fall of 2016, the Guild members who had volunteered visited the lighthouse. While the lighthouse looked okay from the water, close up there was extensive rotted siding and trim work. Entry door jambs were so rotted you could see through the jambs and threshold to the bay water below.

In the spring of 2017, the work on the lighthouse began with the repairs to the door jambs. Virgil led this effort and contributed in setting an example of how the work would be done. The other work was cutting out the rotted siding and trim wood. It also needs to be mentioned that our efforts were greatly assisted by Ruben Arizmendi who provided Spanish cedar and Mahogany wood and Greg Wheet who provided the millwork.



Transportation to and from the lighthouse is provided by Captain Howard Lewis, using his boat, "Audacious", which is kept at Bembe Beach pier in Annapolis.

In June of 2021, Randy Bollinger, Director of Tours for TPSL and a Preservationist for TPSL, as well as being an AWG member, developed the Excel spreadsheet mapping moisture measurement of each side of the exterior of the lighthouse. This information may prove to be an asset in identifying where all the problems with moisture may be, in order to allow AWG to concentrate their repair efforts effectively on those areas.

Between 2017 to now, we have made 48 trips to the lighthouse. The Guild volunteers have contributed

about 660 hours of service to the restoration effort. The condition of the lighthouse has been greatly improved. The role of the Guild volunteers has been changed from restoration to addressing maintenance issues as they become apparent.
