


My lecture: "Bent lamination-cold molding"

One of the things I often implement in my furniture fabrication is a bent lamination in order to achieve my curves.

The lecture will be a demonstration of various ways to perform cold molding-bent lamination. I will show various ways to layer wood to achieve the desired bent laminated look. One focus will be the various glues used in this process. Finally I will demonstrate using clamps, ratchets and a vacuum system to achieve the bent lamination. See viccovonvoss.com.




Call for Speakers from the AWG Membership



AWG 2017 EDUCATIONAL AWARD

Every six months AWG offers the opportunity to a member to receive a George Swisher \$500. Educational Award. The award can be used for training covering a broad field of woodworking interests. At the AWG 2016 Christmas Party I won this award and used it to make a Federal-Style card table.



AWG members, Jim Luck and Jim Francis, who are experienced in building Federal reproductions, were contacted for advice. Pat Applegate provided shellac finishing techniques at one of his mentor classes. Troy Beall, Annapolis Woodworks agreed to have a class of four to make Demilune tables, and one Federal Card Table. We met for five weekends from 8:30 AM – 5 PM. Troy gave excellent instructions and hands-on experiences on all aspects of this class. Members freely shared and discussed their experiences solving problems. This was a tremendous learning experience where questions and problems were readily solved.


Detailed plans for my project were obtained from a Fine Woodworking article by Steve Latta. The design included two challenging joints – a knuckle joint which has a built-in stop to allow the rear legs to open a certain distance and a bridal joint to attach the front legs. The table legs were made from Brazilian mahogany, the top from Honduran mahogany and the apron veneered with mahogany. Other woods included popular, white oak, holly, and ebony for Federal style banding and inlays.

The string inlays, bandings and medallions were inserted after routing with a Dermal whereas the bell flowers were hand-cut from Holly wood and shaded with heated sand prior to installation. Time and patience were required for this task!

Finishing presented many challenges. To retain the details of the inlays the staining and filling of the mahogany was completed before installing the inlays. The inlay decorations were coated with several layers of shellac or water-based lacquer to preserve details. Finally, several coats of shellac followed.

The table was displayed at the April, 2018 AWG meeting. It is destined to be a wedding gift.

Main Raffle: Tickets are \$1.00. For this month we have the usual \$50 gift for Lowes and two router bits.




These router bits are just like the ones used in the box classes to form the profiles last month. The 2 bits we be raffled together as one set.






